Now may the God of peace himself sanctify you completely, and may your whole spirit and soul and body be kept blameless at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. He who calls you is faithful; he will surely do it."

(1 Thess. 5:23-24)

Sanctification is a difficult concept to grasp, because it's hard to believe that Christian perfection can be achieved in any real way. But as the scriptures remind us, God will finish what He has begun in us. What is impossible apart from God is very possible with God.

John Wesley describes it well in this quote concerning gradual sanctification: "From the time of our being 'born again' the gradual work of sanctification takes place. We are enabled by the Spirit to mortify the deeds of the body, of our evil nature, and as we are more and more dead to sin, we are more and more alive to God."

In another quote, Wesley reminds us that it is God who makes us holy: "What God has promised, he is able to perform. Admitting, therefore, that with men it is impossible to bring a clean thing out of an unclean – to purify the heart from all sin and to fill it with all holiness – yet with God all things are possible."

The process of sanctification can be experienced or even seen by the growth in grace of the individual or a body of believers. I believe our church has certainly been growing in grace this past year. I have witnessed the personal spiritual growth of many specific individuals who have felt God's call on their life toward holiness. I have also seen many signs of positive growth in the church as a whole this year and I believe we are hearing and responding to the call of God on this particular body of believers. Perhaps you have seen the signs as well.

We still have a long way to go toward sanctification, both individually and corporately, but God is faithful and will carry us on toward the ultimate goal. Let's keep our eyes fixed on Jesus Christ and keep pushing forward in the direction that God is leading us. In 2023, the best is yet to come!
