A Message From Pastor Jihoon

Dear Grateful Saints,

With Thanksgiving and Christmas approaching, we find ourselves on the cusp of making plans for family gatherings and special worship services. Some often ask me if I am prepared for the upcoming winter here. While understanding the reason for such a question, I believe it's a crucial moment for all of us to ask ourselves: "Are we prepared for embracing the Holy Seasons?"

Thanksgiving and Christmas are joyous occasions, an opportunity to come together and express gratitude for the numerous blessings bestowed upon us. Sometimes, being thankful can be challenging, especially in recent weeks when we've witnessed unprecedented natural disasters or received devastating news about the loss of loved ones or acts of cruelty inflicted upon humanity. In the face of such calamities, it can be difficult to offer our gratitude to God.

As I write this, Halloween is just around the corner, and this Halloween marks the 506th anniversary of Martin Luther's leadership in the Reformation in Germany. As you know, this 16th-century Reformer emphasized three fundamental concepts: Grace alone, Faith alone, and Scripture alone. These three divine gifts are available to everyone, yet we often forget their profound significance.

Another triad we inherit from the Reformation is guilt, grace, and gratitude. Through Scripture and the guidance of the Holy Spirit, we come to recognize our shortcomings, the moments when we've fallen short of the people God intended us to be. Once we confront our sin, we experience a sense of guilt for allowing it to govern our lives. Yet, in this moment of realization, we have the opportunity to

implore God to remove that sin and all its consequences, to start anew through confession. In this confession, we find assurance that God will forgive us, and this is true grace. It's important to emphasize that we don't earn this forgiveness; it is bestowed upon us freely, driven by God's own initiative. This is the work of God, not of our own making.

Receiving forgiveness fills us with gratitude. Without the revelation of our sin by the Holy Spirit, through Scripture, or some other Godgiven experience, we would not comprehend our need for God's grace. If we did not grasp our inability to achieve that grace, we would not genuinely appreciate the most significant gift God can bestow upon us: forgiveness.

These are some of the profound spiritual gifts bequeathed to us by the Reformation. However, gratitude doesn't have to be limited to our liberation from sin; it can extend to our church community, our friends, our family, and countless other blessings in our lives.

So, during these sacred seasons in our nation and church, let us truly reflect on our blessings. While it may not alter our life circumstances, considering the tragedies that surround us, we have indeed been blessed. Let's take a moment each day to express our gratitude to God for one thing we appreciate. Additionally, let us always remember that "every good and perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of the heavenly lights, who does not change like shifting shadows" (James 1:17).

If you are **interested in helping** with costumes or other aspects of the program, contact Denise Morris.






Change A Child's Story
