

A Message From Pastor Jihoon Lee

Beloved Children of God,

As I've observed the recent storms and tornados striking the Midwest, it has led me to contemplate the tempestuous trials we encounter in life. Amidst our reflections during Easter on the promise of new life in Christ, the stark reality often feels distant from hope. We find ourselves grappling with the relentless storms that disrupt our lives, as encapsulated by the poetic notion, "April is a cruel month." Even post-Easter, we navigate a challenging period, confronting more "failure" rather than "triumph."

When you explore the term "triumph" in the thesaurus, you'll encounter synonyms like victory, achievement, and conquest, along with words such as joy, celebration, and jubilation. Conversely, a search for "fail" or "failure" reveals words like defeat, ineffectiveness, and disappointment, among others like wither and collapse. These lexical connections from the thesaurus mirror our societal perspectives on success and failure, often leading to a belief that winning is paramount while failure is intolerable. This mindset can burden many, especially children, with a sense of constant pressure to excel and fear of falling short. Considering that none of us can achieve perfection in our roles as parents, spouses, children, friends, or Christians, this societal framework can lead to a sense of perpetual inadequacy. However, it doesn't have to define our existence. God never intended us to be ensnared in this cycle of pressure and disappointment.

Christ's sacrifice wasn't reserved for those who had achieved success. As Scripture affirms, "at just the right time, when we were still powerless, Christ died for the ungodly" (Romans 5:8). Our heavenly Father orchestrated the sending of Jesus precisely when we were at our weakest, struggling, and at times, feeling like last place finishers. This serves as a profound lesson for us. In our moments of failure and vulnerability, He took decisive action on our
