A Message From Pastor Jihoon Lee

Greetings, Central UMC Community!

As you read this letter, many of you might already be packing your bags or setting out on summer adventures. I recall two years ago, around this time, I was visiting my homeland with my family. Most of my time was spent with my mother, but we also ventured to various places. I excitedly shared with my sons, Joseph and Justin, the stories of "when I was your age" at certain landmarks. Of course, their enthusiasm didn't quite match mine! While reminiscing, we also created new memories. Alongside our planned adventures, we inevitably stumbled upon some spontaneous ones because that's just how trips go. Even in familiar places, we kept our eyes open for new discoveries.

The Hebrew Bible recounts the journeys of biblical patriarchs and matriarchs who lived out their destinies within God's covenant with Abraham and Sarah. In many ways, the narrative in Genesis unfolds like an extended road trip. Abraham and Sarah received an unexpected call from God, prompting them to leave their settled life for one on the road. Their decades-long journey, filled with both highs and lows, took them across the geography of the Middle East. However, Genesis focuses more on the geography of faith.

What makes these stories so compelling is their honest portrayal of flawed characters. Abraham, Sarah, Hagar, Ishmael, Isaac, Rebekah, Esau, Jacob, Rachel, Leah, Dinah, Joseph—not one among them is unblemished. Each has faults and weaknesses, shadow sides hidden even from themselves. This honesty encourages us to lower our guards and see ourselves in their stories, reflecting the full spectrum of human light and darkness.

These stories, though sometimes entertaining, have been passed down through generations not for entertainment, but because they reveal how God interacts with humanity. Despite
