

Children don their backpacks and head back to school, parents rediscover the rhythm of routine, and, yes, the church community awakens from its summer slumber with renewed energy and purpose.

among us, doing what He does best. In the invocation, He reassures us of our baptismal identity, eternally united with Him in His death and resurrection. As we confess our sins, He doesn't just listen—He removes them, casting them into the depths of forgetfulness (absolution). Through the readings, His voice echoes through the ages, teaching, convicting, and most importantly, inviting us back to His embrace for rest, comfort, and life. And as we approach the Lord's Table, it's Jesus Himself who meets us, sustaining us with His very presence and promising, "I will never leave you nor forsake you" (Hebrews 13:5).

The psalmist's words offer a timeless invitation: "If you want to find the God who constantly watches over you, cares for you, and guides you, lift up your eyes and look on high; think where your help is coming from." As we step into September, let it be a time not only of returning to routines but of returning to God. Whether it's in the familiarity of Sunday worship or the quiet moments of everyday life, we are called to draw near to the One who never takes a break from us. Let this season be a reminder that God is not bound by calendars or clocks.
