

Dear Beloved in Christ,

"If I speak in the tongues of men or of angels, but do not have love, I am only a resounding gong or a clanging cymbal. If I have the gift of prophecy and can fathom all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have a faith that can move mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing. If I give all I possess to the poor and give over my body to hard-ship that I may boast, but do not have love, I gain nothing" (1 Corinthians 13:1-3).

By now, many of us are weary of winter and longing for spring. While this year's winter has been relatively mild, it is still winter—and somehow, the shortest month often feels the longest. 
