

A Message From Pastor Jihoon Lee

Dear Friends, in Christ,

"The wind blows wherever it pleases. You hear its sound, but you cannot tell where it comes from or where it is going. So it is with everyone born of the Spirit." – John 3:8

As June unfolds, we find ourselves standing at a quiet threshold—spring yielding to summer, familiar rhythms giving way to new possibilities. The fields are green, the days long and bright, and the air carries a warmth that whispers, "Something new is coming." This is the nature of June: a month of transitions, a season of in-betweens.

We've arrived at the halfway point of 2025. The first six months have carried their share of joy and sorrow, growth and waiting. Time, it seems, moves like water—quiet but relentless, always urging us forward. And here, in the middle of the year, we pause—not to hold back the flow, but to give thanks for the journey so far and to listen for the Spirit's invitation into what comes next.

Graduation ceremonies this month mark life-changing transitions for students and families.
