

A Message From Pastor Jihoon Lee

Dear Beloved Church Family,

July has arrived with all its familiar signals—sweltering heat, sudden downpours, and, of course, the lawn that seems to grow twice as fast the moment you put the mower away. Summer is in full swing. Children are on break, some of us are heading off for long-awaited vacations, and our church is alive with the joy and holy chaos of Vacation Bible School.

It's a season that feels both relaxing and relentless. We long for rest, but the days often fill quickly—with travel plans, yardwork, summer programs, or simply the need to stay cool and hydrated. In the middle of it all, July 4th reminds us of the precious gift of freedom. It's a time to give thanks for our country, to gather with friends and family, and to remember those who have sacrificed for the liberty we enjoy.

But as people of faith, we are also called to reflect on a deeper kind of freedom—the freedom we have in Christ.

In Galatians 5:1, Paul writes: "It is for freedom that Christ has set us free. Stand firm, then, and do not let yourselves be burdened again by a yoke of slavery." Paul isn't talking about political freedom here. He's talking about freedom from fear, guilt, shame, sin, and all the inner chains that can hold us back from living fully and joyfully as God's beloved people.

While political freedom is fragile—guarded by laws, often tested by conflict, and always shaped by human hands—spiritual freedom is eternal. It is a gift, not earned by merit or secured by force, but poured out in grace through Jesus Christ. And this freedom is not just for some, but for all.

What does that look like in the middle of a hot, busy July?

It might look like a parent slowing down during VBS to truly listen to a child's wonder-filled question about God. It might look like someone choosing to forgive an old hurt instead of clinging to resentment. It might look like a person finally laying down a burden of self-doubt and accepting that they are enough—loved, chosen, redeemed. In these moments, we live into the freedom Christ has given us.

This July, I encourage you to rest in that freedom. Not just on the beach or by the lake, but deep in your soul. Take time to breathe. To pray. To read Scripture not out of duty, but desire. To enjoy creation without rushing past it. To notice the simple ways God is working all around you—even in the sound of children laughing during VBS or the smell of fresh-cut grass after a storm.
