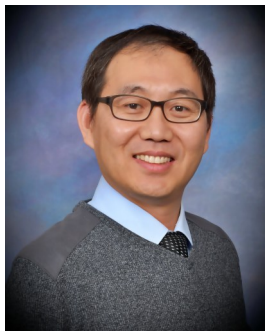

A Message From Pastor Jihoon Lee

Grace and peace to you in the name of Christ.

This past month, Esther and I drove our younger son, Justin, to his new college home. We unloaded boxes, made his bed, and stood a little too long in that small dorm room, trying to delay the inevitable goodbye. As we drove away, the seat behind us felt too empty.

Now, with Justin gone and his older brother Joseph already living on his own, our house is quiet in a way it has never been before. It is just Esther and me. I confess, my heart is tangled with mixed emotions. Gratitude and pride stand side by side with loss and longing.

One of our church members, Phyllis Fox, spoke a word of wisdom that has stayed with me. She said, "Now the two of you must learn how to live together again. Talk with each other. Discover one another all over again." Her words reminded me that it is not only our children who step into new chapters—it is we parents as well. Our kids begin their journeys, but so do we.

September is a season of journeys. Students head off to college or new schools. Some children enter kindergarten for the very first time, others move up to middle or high school. Still others leave home for jobs, marriage, or service. Each step forward requires leaving something behind. Growth always demands letting go.

That is never easy. For parents, it means trusting that the children we raised can walk the path ahead without us holding their hand. For children, it means stepping into places that feel uncertain. For all of us, whether young or old, it means learning to walk by faith into an unfamiliar tomorrow.

The Bible reminds us that God's people have always been on the move. Moses' generation left Egypt, but they never quite let go of the past. Their longing for what was behind them kept them wandering in the wilderness for forty years. Joshua's generation, by contrast, chose differently. They stepped forward. They placed their feet in the Jordan River, and God made a way. They entered the promised land, not because they had
