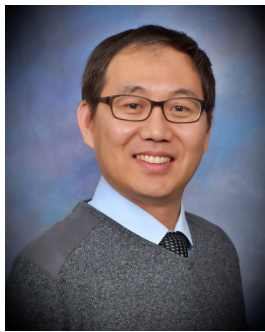

A Message From Pastor Jihoon Lee

Dear pilgrims of the changing seasons,

November has a strange rhythm to it. It's a month that lives in the in-between. The leaves have fallen, yet winter has not fully arrived. The fields are quiet, yet the barns are full. The days grow shorter, but homes grow warmer. November seems to hold its breath between what has been and what is yet to come.

It is also the month of many memories. On the first Sunday, we light candles and whisper names on All Saints Sunday—remembering those who have gone before us. Each flame flickers as a small resurrection, a testimony that love outlasts death. We stand in the quiet company of those who finished their race, and we thank God that the story of faith didn't end with them—it continues in us.

And then, just a few weeks later, the calendar turns to Advent, the season that calls us to watch for new life. The cry of a child will soon pierce the winter air, and hope will return wrapped in swaddling clothes. Between these two Sundays—one that honors the dead and one that anticipates birth—lies Thanksgiving, the bridge that holds them together.

Thanksgiving reminds us that gratitude is the thread that ties past and future, heaven and earth. It is the sacred act of remembering how God has guided us through the valleys and the harvests alike. Around our tables, generations gather—parents, children, grandparents—and stories are told again. We pass mashed potatoes and memories. We laugh. We cry. And without realizing it, we are doing what Israel once did during its great festivals: remembering the mighty acts of God and passing the testimony to the next generation.
