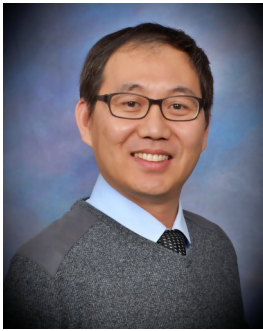

A Message From Pastor Jihoon Lee

Dear Friends Growing under the Summer Sun of Grace,

June brings us into the doorway of summer. The days grow longer. The light lingers in the evening. Gardens begin to stretch upward. Fields turn green. Families plan trips, children finish school, graduates step into new chapters, and many of us begin to look for a slower rhythm, even if only for a little while.

There is something hopeful about summer. It feels like an open window. A deep breath. A season of possibility. And yet, summer is not only gentle. The same sun that warms the garden can also dry the ground. The same light that helps the corn grow can make the air heavy and the day long. Summer gives rest, but it also brings heat. It offers beauty, but it also asks endurance.

Perhaps that is why summer can speak so honestly to our lives. Some of us enter this season with joy. Good news has come. A door has opened. A graduation has been celebrated. A future that once felt uncertain now looks bright. There is reason to smile, reason to give thanks, reason to breathe.

Some of us enter this season differently. The next step is not yet clear. A prayer has not yet been answered. A body is tired. A heart is carrying something quiet. The sun may be shining outside, but inside, the road still feels uncertain. Most of us know both places. Sometimes even at the same time.

Jesus gives us a word for every season: "Abide in me as I abide in you" (John 15:4). He does not say, "Produce fruit by yourself." He does not say, "Try harder until you become strong enough." He says, "Abide." Stay connected. Remain in my love. Let my life flow into yours.

A branch does not bear fruit by clenching its fists. It bears fruit by staying connected to the vine. That is a word for those stepping into bright tomorrows. Your success, your opportunity, your open door—these are gifts. Receive them with gratitude. But do not run so fast into the future that you forget the One who gives life to the branch. Fruit ripens best when it remains close to the vine.

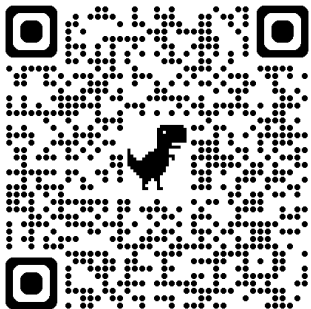

And it is also a word for those walking through heat. Your waiting, your uncertainty, your weariness—these are not signs that God has left you. The branch does not choose the weather. It simply stays connected to the source of life. Sunshine, rain, heat, waiting—all of it can become part of the fruit.

James writes, “The testing of your faith produces endurance” (James 1:3). This does not mean hardship is easy. It does not mean we should pretend the heat does not burn. It means that, in God’s care, even difficult seasons are not wasted. Grace can deepen roots in the very soil we would not have chosen.

So perhaps the invitation of June is not only to rest, and not only to prepare for what comes next. Perhaps the deeper invitation is to abide. To breathe with Christ. To receive the light without worshipping it. To endure the heat without being destroyed by it. To trust that growth is happening, even when it is slow, hidden, and unfinished.

Summer reminds us that life with God is not always rushed. Fruit does not appear overnight. Gardens do not grow by panic. Souls do not mature by pressure alone. We grow by grace, by time, by light, by endurance, and above all, by remaining in Christ.

So this June, whether your next season feels bright or uncertain, peaceful or demanding, may you hear the gentle voice of Jesus: “Abide in me.”

Stay close to the Vine.

There is grace enough for the light. There is grace enough for the heat. And there is grace enough for the fruit God is still growing in us.
