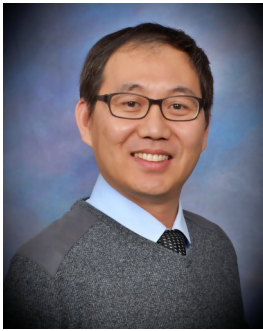

A Message From Pastor Jihoon Lee

Grace and peace to you in this new season,

The air has shifted. Morning breezes carry a coolness that wasn't there a few weeks ago. Trees, once clothed in summer's green, now trade their garments for gold, crimson, and amber. Fields bow heavy with grain, their heads bending low as though in prayer, waiting for harvest. Autumn has arrived.

Every harvest tells a story. In spring, a farmer scatters seed into the dark soil—not with proof in hand, but with promise in heart. The promise is unseen, but it is enough to send him out with hope. Through long days of sun and storm, through patient waiting, he trusts what he cannot see. Now, months later, the fields answer back. The promise has held. The seed has grown. The harvest confirms what was trusted in the spring. Faith works in much the same way. The writer of Hebrews reminds us that “faith is confidence in what we hope for and assurance about what we do not see” (Hebrews 11:1). Each season of our lives brings us moments when God's promises move from unseen to confirmed—from seed to stalk, from hope to harvest. Sometimes it happens quietly, in answered prayers we almost forgot we prayed. Sometimes it happens in larger ways, when life itself bears witness to God's faithfulness across years.

This fall, our church family enters such a season of confirmation. Alongside the new start of Sunday School, we are blessed to begin a Confirmation Class with three of our young people—Jackson Lahner, Nolan Bollinger, and Nyla Canfield.

Confirmation is no small step. In the United Methodist Church, it is the moment when young people claim for themselves the promises once spoken over them at baptism. Parents and church once said, “This child belongs to Christ.” Now the young disciple says, “Yes, this faith is mine. This Savior is my Savior.” The promise is confirmed, not only by words but by choice, by heart, by life.

Over the years, I have listened to countless stories from members of all ages—elderly saints, parents raising children, faithful disciples who have walked long roads. Again and again, they speak with gratitude about their Confirmation class. Some recall the

lessons that opened Scripture to them. Others remember friendships that lasted for decades. Still others describe a holy moment at the altar rail, when they felt the Spirit's presence as they whispered their first "yes" to God. These memories linger like the sweetness of a harvest gathered in. They testify that Confirmation is more than a program—it is a season that can shape a soul for a lifetime.

My prayer is that Jackson, Nolan, and Nyla will find the same. May their hearts be impressed with the goodness of God, their minds sharpened by the truth of Christ, and their spirits lifted by the presence of the Holy Spirit. May their Confirmation be not only a class completed but a faith confirmed. And may they, years from now, look back and say, "It was then that I learned to trust God's promises for myself."

But this journey is not theirs alone. Just as no harvest is gathered without the work of many hands, no faith matures without the care of a community. Teachers will guide them. Parents will encourage them. And the whole congregation is called to surround them in prayer. That is why I ask you: remember their names. Speak a blessing when you see them in the hallways. Whisper a prayer when they come to mind. Encourage them with your words, your smiles, your faithful presence in worship.

This fall, as farmers gather grain from the fields, let us gather around our young disciples. Let us confirm, with our lives and prayers, the promises of God. For just as surely as seeds grow into harvest, so the word of God will not return empty, but will accomplish what He intends (Isaiah 55:11). And in that promise, we can rest secure.
